Accompanied only by Bruna, her housekeeper and perhaps the person closest to her, María reveals part of her secrets, those that filled her life and those that led her to a tragic death at the age of 53.”

without any tricks or cameras, a Mara that sees Callas from afar and admires her, apologising for the life she lived.

A work of music in which the great arias that became greater with her voice –‘O mio babbino caro’ (*Gianni Schicchi*), ‘Vissi d’arte’ (*Tosca*) by Giacomo Puccini; ‘Habanera’ (*Carmen*) by George Bizet; ‘Casta diva’ (*Norma*) by Vincenzo Bellini...– will alternate with an exquisite text by Pedro Villora and extraordinary performances.” Alberto Frías
